Telephone: 999

(If you are deaf, deafened, hard of hearing or have a speech impairment, a **text phone is available on 18000**)

You should use these numbers if:

- A crime is happening right now.
- Someone is in immediate danger, or there is a risk of serious damage to property.
- A suspect for a serious crime is nearby.
- There is a traffic collision involving injury or danger to other road users.

NON-EMERGENCY

Telephone: 101

(If you are deaf, deafened, hard of hearing or have a speech impairment, a **text phone is available on 18001 101**)

You should use these non-emergency numbers to:

- Report a crime not currently in progress - for example a stolen car, burglary, or damaged property.
- Report a minor traffic collision.
- Give information to the police about crime in your area.
- Speak to the police about a general enquiry.
- Contact a specific police officer or member of staff.



Incident or Accident Procedure

- Stay calm but act swiftly and observe the situation
- Is there a risk of further injury?
- Listen to what the injured person is saying
- Alert the qualified First Aider who should take appropriate action for minor injuries
- In the event of an injury requiring emergency treatment, call the emergency services on 999
- In event of a non-emergency injury requiring guidance or support, call NHS 111
- Deal with the rest of the group and ensure that they are adequately supervised and safe
- Do not move someone with major injuries. Wait for the emergency medics.
- Contact the injured person's parent / carer / guardian/ relative
- Complete an Incident / Accident Report Form as soon as possible
